E. Notary Fee Increase

The County's current fee schedule shows notary fees are \$5. The General Assembly has increased the maximum fees that may be charged by a notary for notarial acts to \$10. We have noticed discrepancies in the notary fees charged by departments. The Finance Committee recommends approval to raise notary fees for all departments to \$10.

F. Vincent Holding, LLC

The County and Vincent Holding, LLC have agreed to the value of \$63,000 for the property located at 1412 Herrington Road. The NC Property Tax Commission has ordered this is the value for tax year 2021. The County Attorney is requesting the Board formally consent to this value.

B. Repeal of Prohibition of Tattooing Ordinance

In reviewing the County ordinances, the County Attorney discovered there is still a "Prohibition of Tattooing" in Pasquotank County. This ordinance was adopted in 1980. This ordinance conflicts with the current regulations in the Zoning Ordinance. Currently, Tattoo Parlors are allowed in a C-1 District. The County Attorney is recommending the "Prohibition of Tattooing" Ordinance be repealed.

C. <u>Amendment of Certain County Ordinances with Criminal Penalties to Comply with</u> Session Law 2021-138

As a result of recent legislation involving criminal penalties in local ordinances, several of the County's ordinances need revision to comply with the new law. Attached is a memo from County Attorney Mike Cox explaining why the changes are necessary and which ordinances are affected.
